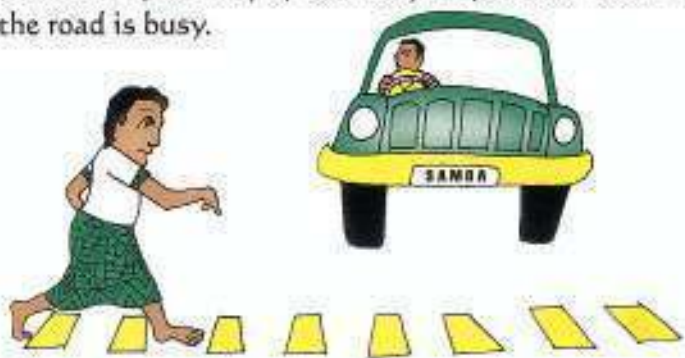

Be a Safe Road User



- 1. Crossing at an Island refuge.**
Cross the first half of the road, stop at the island if the road is busy.



- 2. Zebra Crossing.**
Wait till the vehicles have stopped or slowed down before you cross.



- 3. Traffic Lights**
Wait for the "Green Man" before you cross quickly.



- 4. Open Country Road.**
Do not cross near Bends.



- 5. Open sub-urban road.**
Watch out for small and silent cars from both directions.



- 6. Open City Road.**
Look for a safe place to cross.

PARENTS

The Safety Sevens Cord gives advice on crossing the road. It is for all pedestrians. Children should be taught the Safety Seven Code and should not be allowed out alone until they can understand and use the code properly.

THE SAFETY SEVENS CODE

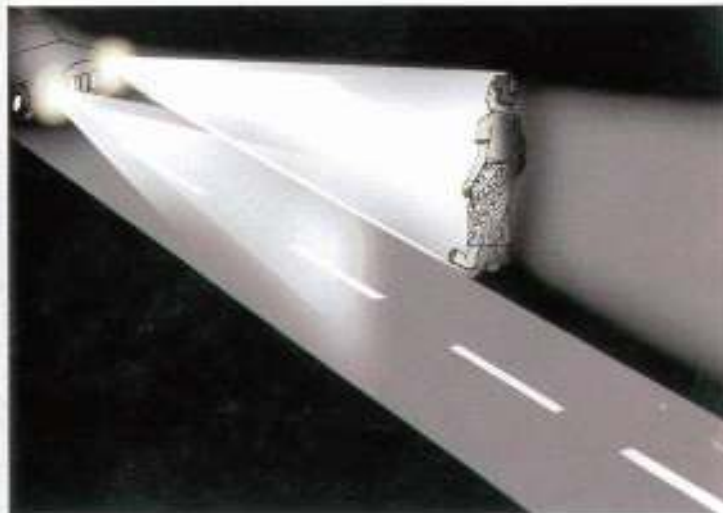
1. First find a safe place to cross.
(pedestrian crossing, school patrol, lights).
2. Stop: when you stop it helps you to look around, listen and think.
3. Stand back a little from the edge of the road.
4. Look around for moving traffic.
5. If traffic is near and coming towards you. Let it pass.
6. When there is no traffic near in either direction walk quickly across the road.
7. Keep looking and listening for traffic while you're crossing
